UKRAINE REBORN

In November 2013, Ukraine's President Yanukovych signalled an end to EU talks - the eastern European state was instead, to move closer to its neighbour Russia, a nation that had dominated Ukraine for centuries.

There was an outcry at Yanukovych's decision but little was done until a single Facebook post sent hundreds of students to occupy Maidan Square in the capital Kiev. The students' peaceful demonstrations were met by violence as the feared Berkut police unleashed a wave of brutality. But the students, now joined by thousands from across the political spectrum, clung on.

After the police had used tear gas, stun grenades and live ammunition, the protesters began to reply with stones, Molotov cocktails and hunting rifles - a battle for the 'soul of the nation' had begun.

In February 2014, with over a dozen protesters already dead or dying, Russia's Prime Minister called for an even bloodier crackdown - Yanukovych's government was, he said, being treated 'like a doormat...' Within hours Yanukovych responded with savage force; over 100 protesters were shot dead and dozens more wounded. The people of Kiev rose en masse and the Berkut disintegrated as Yanukovych abandoned his palace and fled to President Putin's Russia.

Euromaidan had won - Ukraine's so-called "Revolution of Dignity" had succeeded but within weeks Putin's Special Forces had seized Crimea and armed eastern separatists, sparking a low level war that continues to this day.

Yet across the country and especially in Kiev, the young - who fought in Maidan Square - have now seized the moment to claim once-repressed freedoms.

Kiev is a unique, picturesque city, its 6th Century roots far older than Moscow's, its architecture and transport a bizarre mix of 1970s trams and Soviet era metros with cutting edge WI-FI and 21st Century design. It's also the capital of Ukraine who's eastern war - and its Russian connections - might yet bring down America's President Trump or even possibly start World War Three. Yet little is known in the West about Kiev or its blossoming art scene.

KIEV UNBROKEN: Ukraine Reborn is a documentary about the work, lives and reality of talented young creatives in Ukraine - with its main focus being on Kiev. For a small but increasing number of well-travelled adventurers, Kiev - despite Ukraine's continuing problems with corruption - is fast becoming the New London, the New Berlin. It is a metropolis of three million people, a city which has more bridges than Paris, more hills than San Francisco, more greenery than London,

more trams than Warsaw and more night-clubs than Los Angeles. A city where artists can both survive and often thrive and where - in spite of the continuing low-level war - there is still that rarity: idealistic hope.

As well as male and female soldiers - and Maidan Square veterans - the **KIEV UNBROKEN** crew are interviewing and observing an outstanding series of artists, photographers, actors, editors, sculptors and musicians; each one an up-and-coming name. Through this **KIEV UNBROKEN** aims to expose the massive and massively overlooked talent of a nation - and of a city that was once called the "Paris of the East" as all the while, the threat of invasion continues to hang over it.

Capturing a unique Slavic mix - art reportage meets an eastern **BUENA VISTA SOCIAL CLUB** - the film **KIEV UNBROKEN** is the first feature length documentary to go beyond the war headlines and deep into the heart of the most artistically motivated places in the modern world: Kiev, Ukraine, frontline of the new Cold War.





Ayna Vilberg is a successful Ukrainian singer, musician and music mentor who's previous role - as a band member - led to her not only charting, on numerous occasions, but also connecting with various other artists including the much-vaunted photographer Ubik Litvin.

Alla Shermetevia is one of Ukraine's leading new art dealers – a regular in London, Paris, Milan and Berlin where she has helped stage many exhibitions and events. Alla is also co-founder of Kiev's acclaimed Art Cult Foundation.





Anael Sunny is a former theology student from Kiev, a painter, pianist and singer with a truly haunting voice. Her paintings have been exhibited in Milan, Rome, Paris, the Middle East, in Kiev and throughout her native Ukraine, while her vocal talents have led to performances on three continents.




Maria Popova was a participant in the Maidan Square events and was PA to President Poroshenko during 2015. Maria is currently on the board of Ukraine's National Modernisation Programme.

Panivalkova are one of Kiev's leading new music groups. An all-girl trio who's unique blend of old and new sounds have led them to create their own genre of 'Sensual Minimalism'. They have already released two albums and played the main stages at the Gogolfest, the Kotebel Jazz Festival and at the Odessa International Film Festival. Sasha Syvets is a former political science student who is now a young veteran of the Ukrainian Army Signal Corps. She was present in the Maidan uprising and is currently based in the east of the country, within the danger area of the 'de-militarised' zone.



Sasha Veter is the guitarist, song-writer and frontman with the band **Eighth Day**. Both he and other members of the band both played concerts and fought with the feared Berkut police during Maidan. He and the band are currently celebrating a new recording contract.

Ubik Litvin is perhaps the leading fashion and art photographer in Ukraine, having shot material for numerous labels, including **AMG** and **DNK**, as well as working in the USA, Switzerland, Italy and Germany. Starting as a lay-out artist, his photographic work has since won him many awards and been the subject of numerous exhibitions in Kiev, the Ukraine and around Europe.








Trump Seems to Side With Putin's Russia in Comments on Ukraine
